Act 13 Program Guidelines July 2022

The Elk County Commissioners have established a grant program that will redistribute a portion of their allocation of the Act 13 Marcellus Shale Impact Fee for local projects. Act 13 Impact Fees are disbursed by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (PUC) directly to local governments to mitigate the impacts of unconventional gas well drilling and may be used for a variety of projects.

Eligible applicants include municipal governing bodies, 501 © non-profit organizations, or municipal authorities. Municipal authorities must submit a written support letter from the local governing body. Nonprofit organizations are exempt from this requirement.

Grant requests must be a minimum of \$1,000 up to the maximum amount of \$10,000.

This grant is an open application that will be **due in-office by the close of business on February 29th and August 31st** each year. In the event that the deadline falls on a weekend, the previous Friday will be the due date. Projects will be awarded by the last day of March and September. **Please Note:** the total maximum amount awarded during any one funding cycle will be \$75,000.

While multiple applications may be received from eligible applicants, each request must be a unique project activity. Only one project activity will be accepted within a twelve-month period.

Eligible Project Activities Include:

- Roads, bridges, and public infrastructure: construction, reconstruction & maintenance.**
Please Note: Bridges must be locally owned (over 20 feet in length) are routinely inspected, are within the Bridge Management System (BMS), and are part of the overall transportation infrastructure.
- Water, stormwater, and sewer systems: construction, reconstruction, maintenance/repair.**
- Emergency preparedness and public safety: law enforcement, fire services, hazardous material response, 911 equipment acquisitions.**
- Environmental programs, including trails, parks, recreation, open space, floodplain management, conservation districts, and agriculture preservation.**
- Surface water and groundwater: supply preservation and reclamation.**
- Affordable housing projects that increase availability.**
- Records management, GIS, and information technology (IT).**
- Social services.**
- Planning initiatives under the Municipal Planning Code (MPC).**
- Career & Technical Centers for oil and gas industry training.**

Project Selection

During each funding cycle, the Elk County Board of Commissioners and the Project Selection Committee will meet to determine project eligibility. While no one project will be judged a higher priority based on its eligibility, there may be other factors that will be considered during the review process.

Other factors to be considered include but are not limited to:

- Verification that all other monies necessary to complete the work have been committed.
- Commitment that the project will be completed within a twelve-month period. Any project not completed within the 12 months will risk forfeiture of the grant award.
- Demonstrate that the project will serve a broad public benefit, address a safety compliance issue, or meet an emergency need. At no time will requests be considered from municipalities that are intended to supplement or subsidize normal daily operations.

Project Awards

Grant award recipients will receive notification by letter that will include a cooperation agreement with the County of Elk stating their understanding of the Elk County Act 13 Program Guidelines. In addition, this agreement will verify that:

- the grant award will not deviate from the scope of work and;
- that no monies received will be used for expenses incurred before the county award letter and;
- the grant recipient will verify that all necessary permits, environmental studies, and similar regulatory requirements are met.
- This Coop Agreement must be completed and referred to the County in the designated time frame or you may risk forfeiture of the award.

All grant award recipients will be required to submit a grant close-out report within twelve months of receipt of funding that will include copies of invoices that were used by the grant requirements, copies of checks used to remit on said invoices, and photographs where applicable.

Grant applications are available online at www.co.elk.pa.us. Applicants are encouraged to review the application thoroughly and provide all of the information requested.
